Project Overview

Truckee North Tahoe Bike Share Project will grant free access to bikes, helmets, and safety and etiquette training to Truckee/North Tahoe youth <u>to facilitate</u> <u>access</u> to required equipment and make the Truckee Bike Park more accessible to any active youth interested in the bike park experience!



Plan Objectives

- Identify community stakeholders to facilitate access to resources
- Identify and secure \$7,500 in funding from sponsorships or donations
- Secure minimum 10 bikes for use at the park
- Develop safety and etiquette training program
- Refine administration of the program
 - Liability insurance coverage
 - Volunteer base
 - $_{\circ}~$ Procedures for the kids to use the bikes

Develop Needs Assessment Survey

- Looked at kids of all ages
- Engaged kids in Truckee and North Tahoe
- Did the kids know the Bike Park existed?
- Do they have a bike to use at the park?

Survey Results



of the participants have NOT visited the Bike Park.



If you have not been, what are the reasons?

- I do not have a ride (23%)
- I do not have a bike to ride (10%)
- I don't know how to use the track (8%)
- I didn't know about it or where it is (43%)
- Other (16%)

Survey Results

Significant Findings:

51% of participants who have not been to the bike park state it is because *they do not know of it, how to use it, its hours of operation or location*.

NOT because they did not have access to bike.

Post-Pivot Project Overview

Truckee North Tahoe Bike Share Project will help to **promote awareness** and access to the Truckee Bike Park and continue to evaluate the need for bikes, helmets and education to participants needing access to these services. We will also continue **to be a support to the Truckee Bike Park** to make it more accessible to any active youth interested in the bike park experience!

- Distribute flyer to students prior to end of school year.
 - Truckee Bike Park Project summer hours and events
 - Local resources (transportation, bike programs & summer camps)
- Conduct second needs assessment survey at beginning of 2014-2015 school year.

 - Proceed with the original Bike Share Program?
 - Conclude project?
